

### How much? How many?

There are four forms of the question word **cuánto**, that changes according to the gender and number of the noun.

masculine singular	feminine singular	masculine plural	feminine plural
¿Cuánto?	¿Cuánta?	¿Cuántos?	¿Cuántas?

### Stress and accents

**Rule 1:**  
Words ending in a vowel, 'n' or 's':  
stress last but one syllable.  
*una naranja*

**Rule 2:**  
Words ending in a consonant (not 'n' or 's'): stress last syllable.  
*un pastel*

**Rule 3:**  
Words that do not follow the rules: accent shows where to stress.  
*un plátano*
