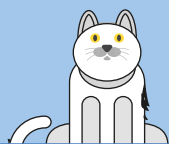
Position of adjectives

In Spanish, most adjectives are positioned after the noun they describe.



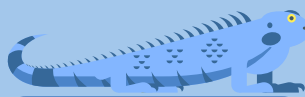
